

WHAT WE BELIEVE:

Triune God:

We believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth (Genesis 1:1).

We believe that Jesus Christ is his only Son, the only Savior of the world. We believe our Lord: Was conceived by the Holy Spirit (Luke 1:34:35). Was born of the Virgin Mary (Galatians 4:4). Suffered under Pontius Pilate (Matthew 27:1-2; 26-28, John 19:1-16).

Was crucified (Matthew 27:32-38,48,50; Mark 15:21-26, 36,37; Luke 23:26-33,38; John 19:17-29). Died (Luke 23:46; John 19:30) and was buried (Matthew 27:57-60; Mark 15:42-46; Luke 23:50-54; John 19:38-42). Descended into hell and on the third day he rose again from the dead (Matthew 28:1-8; Mark 16:1-8; Luke 24:1-12; John 20:1-9). Ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty (Mark 16:19-20; John 20:17; Acts 1:9). From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

We believe the Holy Spirit is the third person in the Godhead (Genesis 1:2; 1 John 5:8). We believe in the indwelling of the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 5:18), and the baptism of the Holy Spirit to empower the believer to witness for Christ (Acts 1:8).

Salvation:

We believe our salvation has been purchased by the shed blood of our Lord Jesus Christ (1 Peter 1:18-19).

We believe salvation is obtained by grace through faith (Ephesians 2:8-9) and by confessing our sins, repenting of them, and trusting Christ wholeheartedly for salvation (Romans 10:9-10).

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the communion of the saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting.


MISSION AND VISION OF THE CHURCH

Replacing Lost or Stolen identification cards

There is a \$5. charge for replacement of an identification card unless the replacement is necessitated by change of name or change of identification.

The loss or theft of an identification card should be reported promptly to the Bible Institute by leaving a written message in the Bible Institute's mailbox located in the lower level of the church or by notifying the Student Coordinator.

Textbooks - Cost varies by course.

NEW MEMBERS

The following fees are waived for new members of Beloved St. John Evangelistic Church registering for Discovering Your Faith I:

- One-time Application Fee \$15 (application fee charged when registering for the 2nd course)
- Course Fee \$20 (course fee charged for all classes taken after DYF I)
- Student Identification Card (cost of identification card charged when registering for the 2nd course)

(Costs are reviewed each year and are subject to change)

PROGRAM POLICIES

It is recommended that courses be taken in consecutive order as described by the program guide.

Course units are valid for seven (7) years from the date of completion of each program. All courses must be completed with 80% attendance and a grade of "C" or better in order to qualify for graduation of each program.

All courses are at a post high school level.

All students must have completed a college level English course and show proof of a passing grade from the school or institution that it was taken. An official transcript or original letterhead from the school or institution must be received prior to the completion of the (3rd) course taken within a program.

If you have not completed a college level English course prior to enrollment, you must complete a college level English course or complete the English Seminar offered by the Bible Institute, prior to the completion of the (4^{rth} course taken within a program.

Our studies are not under the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Department of Education.

TEXT BOOKS

Text books vary in cost. Students will receive their syllabus, course outline and all other materials on the first day of class unless otherwise notified.

CLASS WITHDRAWAL

There are no cash refunds for class withdrawals. Credit may be applied based upon the following criteria:

First week 75% Credit transfer

Second week 50% Credit transfer

Third week and thereafter No Credit transfer

If a student must withdraw from a class they are required to complete a "Request to Withdraw" form and return the form to the instructor of the course that they desire to withdraw from.

GRADING SYTEM

The Bible Institute operates on an honor system; however, cheating will not be tolerated. Any student found cheating will automatically receive a failing grade (F) for the examination.

When school standards are violated, full resolution of the issue(s) may require limited disclosure of the issue(s) to the individuals directly involved. For example, an admission of dishonesty in a class assignment will need to be resolved with the teacher and student involved. Disciplinary action may be taken, and a record of the disciplinary action placed in your file.

If a student misses a quiz or a homework assignment it is there responsibility to contact their instructor regarding the quiz and contact their instructor or fellow classmate before the next class to schedule a make-up exam, if permitted or request the missed assignment. Neglecting to take the appropriate steps will result in a failing grade (F) for the assignment or exam.

Grades are determined by attendance, class participation, completed homework assignments and special projects. Students will also be graded on Term papers, Quizzes, Mid-Term and Final exam scores. Incomplete assignments are factored into the final grade.

BIBLE INSTITUTE COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

ACTS/MISSIONS - This course is a study of the book of Acts, showing the growth of the church, the work of the Holy Spirit, combined with the study of missions and missionary outreach.

BIBLICAL ENGLISH COMPOSITION - This course will help students develop their writing skills as they write about biblical events and characters.

BIBLE INTRODUCTION - This course is designed to build foundation for personal Bible study with an emphasis on the origin, authorship, and presentation of the Bible. It will also give the student the knowledge on how to answer critics of the Bible.

BIBLICAL SELF-CONFRONTATION - This course will teach you how to approach circumstances, relationships, and situations of life from a biblical perspective and to experience victory and contentment in all of life's trials, tests, and problems and to prepare you to counsel others biblically.

CHRISTIAN APOLOGETICS - This course is an introduction to examining evidence to substantiate the claims of Christianity...can it be proven?

CHRISTIAN ETHICS- This course examines critical questions such as abortion, euthanasia, bioethics, human sexuality, politics, war, capital punishment, race, the arts, and the environment from a biblical viewpoint.

CHRISTIAN LIFE - This course is designed as a foundation to equip the child of God to mature in their relationship with Christ, to walk by faith, and to be a witness to others.

CHRISTIAN MUSIC - This course introduces music as a part of worship to God using the guidelines of the word of God.

CHURCH HISTORY - A basic introduction to the subject of perspectives of church history covering four major periods from the Day of Pentecost to the Present: the Ancient Church, the Medieval Church, the Reformation Church, and the Modern Church. This course is designed to provide Christians with an overview of their spiritual heritage

DISCIPLESHIP - This course is a study of how the power of God will shape Christians to become disciples. Obedience, discipline, and submission to the commands of God will be stressed.

DOCTRINE - A study of salvation and inspiration of the scriptures and the church.

EVANGELISM - A must for every Christian. This course introduces effective techniques that win souls for Christ.

HERMENEUTICS – this course is an introductory course for those students that want to learn about Bible interpretation; covering basic rules and guidelines for interpretation.

LEADERSHIP - This course explains the difference in leaders who are effective and those who are efficient and what this means to the local church. Explore the wide variety of areas with which volunteer and professional church leaders must contend today

NEW TESTAMENT SURVEY - This course is a skillful weaving of the New Testament books which centralizes around the theme of the person Jesus Christ.

OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY I - This course is a study of the books of Genesis through Esther. Background information will be presented and mighty works of God among men will be examined.

OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY II - A continuation study of the Old Testament surveying the books of Job through Malachi. Background information will be presented, and the mighty works of God among men will be examined.

PUBLIC SPEAKING - Designed to improve oral and grammar skills. This course will help those who speak in public.

TEACHING TECHNIQUES - This course will stress alternative teaching methods, which will show how to communicate Biblical truths and apply them not only to classroom situations, but also to life.

TRIUNE GOD - This course is a study of how God reveals Himself in three distinct persons. Through this study, God's people will come to know God the Father, Christ the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

UNDERSTANDING PEOPLE - This study gives insight into the personalities, problems, experiences, interests, and needs of people.

ROMANS - This course examines the epistle of Romans. Students will examine a detailed expository survey that helps them understand the main message and theme of this letter written by the Apostle Paul and how it applies to their life

UNDERSTANDING TEACHING - This course examines a biblical understanding of teaching through the empowerment of the Holy Spirit, insight into God's Word, sharp communication skills, and accurate interaction with students. This is a companion course to Teaching Techniques



What issues related to serving and being served have been raised for you?

How have you yourself been served by your efforts to serve others?

What qualities of leadership do you most admire?

What have you seen in others that has exemplified your idea of successful leadership?

Of what needs in the church have you become aware? How did they come to your attention?
